LET'S GO BACK HOME

The example of the younger son in the parable of the prodigal son has much to say to us as disciples. Sometimes we can find ourselves losing our identity because we have gradually drifted away from a loving relationship with our Father in Heaven. Or perhaps we feel that we are alienated and in a foreign land where no one cares for our needs. For each of us, there is a point of awakening when we realize our need to return and restore the relationship we have lost. The emptiness and hunger of the stomach is nothing compared to the emptiness and hunger for love, acceptance, and forgiveness experienced by the human heart in such moments.

Sometimes we don't know how to find our way home to the Father. It is in these moments especially that the example of the Prodigal Son should inspire us. We have only to get up, go and ask to be a member of the Father's family once again. Our words don't have to be perfect.
